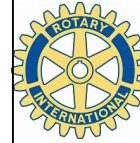

Past DG Chris Simms Guest Speaker

Chris spoke about Rotary Foundation which is a not for profit charitable trust that has been in existence since 1917.

There are 3 main funds Permanent Fund, Annual Program fund and Polio Plus fund.

Permanent fund. A portio of this fund is put towards Foundation Programs

Annual Program fund. Humanitarian, Educational and Cultural programs

Polio Plus fund. There to eradicate Polio through mass immunisation as well as research.

Annual programs fund contributed to by the district is divided into 2, 50% which goes to the world fund and the other 50% goes to the district designated fund. Funding is used 3 years after receiving and the interest earned for those years is used to cover general administration and fund development. This year the fund provided \$71,500 which is the amount contributed 3 years earlier and is being used to support the following:
